Responsive Reading of Psalm 46

This Psalm centers our hearts and minds on the power of our God to save us.

P: God is our refuge and strength,*

C: **an ever-present help in trouble.**

P: Therefore we will not fear, though the earth give way*

C: **and the mountains fall into the heart of the sea,**

P: though its waters roar and foam*

C: **and the mountains quake with their surging.**



P: There is a river whose streams make glad the city of God,*

C: **the holy place where the Most High dwells.**

P: God is within her, she will not fall;*

C: **God will help her at break of day.**

P: "Be still, and know that I am God;*

C: **I will be exalted among the nations, I will be exalted in the earth."**

Confession of Sins

We confess our sins before each other and the Lord. The Bible tells us that repentance (confessing our sins) is one of the marks of a heart that truly believes in what Jesus has done.

M: Dear friends, let us approach God with repentance and confess our sins, asking him in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ to forgive us.

C: **Lord of life, I confess that I am by nature dead in sin.**

I have shown a lack of faith when I have doubted your promises and have worried even though you have shown me your love.

I have trusted in myself and not in you, I have pushed myself ahead when I should have cared less about myself and more about others.

I have thoughtlessly sinned and have chosen to sin even when I know it is wrong

I have sinned in thought, word and action. I have also sinned by not doing the things that you ask me to do.

For all the evil and sin that are part of me and my life, you should cast me away from your presence forever. O Lord, I am sorry for my sins. Please forgive me, for Jesus' sake.

We have a moment of silence for private confession of our specific sins to God.

Absolution of Sins

The use of the keys is that special power and right which Christ gave to his church on earth: to forgive the sins of penitent sinners. See John 20:21-23.



M: Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again. We can see the love of God in our Savior, Jesus. In his great mercy, God made us alive in Christ even when we were dead in our sins. Hear the word of Christ through his called servant: I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the Son (+) and of the Holy Spirit.

C: Amen.

Song of Thanksgiving:

The Lord has blessed us with earthly gifts and heavenly forgiveness, we thank him for his blessings to us and to many others.

We sing together the verses 1 & 2 of hymn 376.

1 Jesus, your blood and righteousness My beauty are, my glorious dress;
Mid flaming worlds, in these arrayed, With joy shall I lift up my head.

M: Let us pray.

The Word

Worship focuses on what our Triune God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit has done to save us. We use God's Word as the center of our worship, praise and thanks.

First Lesson: Number 21:4-9

Job approached God with the wrong attitude. He came with more accusations than questions. Finally, God answers Job. It wasn't what Job expected or wanted. But it was the answer he needed.

Then the LORD answered Job out of the storm. He said: ² "Who is this that darkens my counsel with words without knowledge? ³ Brace yourself like a man; I will question you, and you shall answer me.

⁴ "Where were you when I laid the earth's foundation? Tell me, if you understand.

⁵ Who marked off its dimensions? Surely you know! Who stretched a measuring line across it?

⁶ On what were its footings set, or who laid its cornerstone— ⁷while the morning stars sang together and all the angels shouted for joy?

⁸ "Who shut up the sea behind doors when it burst forth from the womb, ⁹ when I made the clouds its garment and wrapped it in thick darkness, ¹⁰ when I fixed limits for it and set its doors and bars in place, ¹¹ when I said, 'This far you may come and no farther; here is where your proud waves halt?'

Songs and Prayers for Children

These songs and prayers are ones that, for many years, parents and grandparents have taught to their children. I Want to Live for Jesus

1. I want to live for Jesus
And please him every day.
He died in pain and sorrow
To take my sins away.

2. I want to work for Jesus
There's much that I can do
To cheer my friends and neighbors
And serve my Savior, too.

The Second Lesson: 2 Corinthians 5:14-21

Christ love compels in all we do.

For Christ's love compels us, because we are convinced that one died for all, and therefore all died. ¹⁵ And he died for all, that those who live should no longer live for themselves but for him who died for them and was raised again.

¹⁶ So from now on we regard no one from a worldly point of view. Though we once regarded Christ in this way, we do so no longer. ¹⁷ Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation; the old has gone, the new has come! ¹⁸ All this is from God, who reconciled us to himself through Christ and gave us the ministry of reconciliation: ¹⁹ that God was reconciling the world to himself in Christ, not counting men's sins against them. And he has committed to us the message of reconciliation. ²⁰ We are therefore Christ's ambassadors, as though God were making his appeal through us. We implore you on Christ's behalf: Be reconciled to God. ²¹ God made him who had no sin to be sin for us, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God.

P: Alleluia. Because we are his children, God has sent the Spirit of his Son into our hearts, crying, "Abba! Father!" Alleluia.

C: Praise be to you, Oh Lord!!

Please rise for the Gospel, the words and works of our Savior, Jesus.

The Gospel: Mark 4: 35-41

³⁵ That day when evening came, he said to his disciples, "Let us go over to the other side."

³⁶ Leaving the crowd behind, they took him along, just as he was, in the boat. There were also other boats with him. ³⁷ A furious squall came up, and the waves broke over the boat, so that it was nearly swamped. ³⁸ Jesus was in the stern, sleeping on a cushion. The disciples woke him and said to him, "Teacher, don't you care if we drown?"

³⁹ He got up, rebuked the wind and said to the waves, "Quiet! Be still!" Then the wind died down and it was completely calm.

⁴⁰ He said to his disciples, "Why are you so afraid? Do you still have no faith?"

⁴¹ They were terrified and asked each other, "Who is this? Even the wind and the waves obey him!"

P: This is the Word of the Lord

C: Thanks be to you Oh, Christ!

- C:** I believe in God, the Father Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth.
I believe in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended into hell. The third day He rose again from the dead. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of God the Father almighty. From there He will come to judge the living and the dead.
I believe in the Holy Spirit – the holy Christian Church, the communion of saints the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen

 Of present grace And joys above.

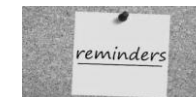
2 Oh, then, with hymns of praise These hallowed courts shall ring!
